Portland, OR, – The 2016 Spirit of L'Arche Award will be presented to St. Andrew Catholic Church on Thursday, May 19 at L'Arche Portland's annual Spring Social. The Spirit of L'Arche Award was created in 2014 to honor "a person or organization in Portland that embodies <u>L'Arche Portland's mission to announce and share the gifts of people with intellectual disabilities."
